





SAC Sustainable Development Goals QUALITY EDUCATION For Social Impact








Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all.


Structured Education Programs





Students enrolled with Spark-A-Change Foundation are primarily first-generation learners. Poor pre-schooling results in learning gaps that only widen with each year in school. They struggle to cope with curriculum in secondary school forcing them to dropout or perform below potential in their board exams.

SAC education programs are conducted through:



SAC curriculum at the Learning Centers aim at strengthening foundational literacy and numeracy skills in primary children builds and conceptual understanding of English and Math concepts which helps into them ease secondary curriculum without much difficulty.

Over the past 5 years, SAC has developed a curriculum that targets at bridging the learning gaps during the formative years to help the child ease into the syllabus outlined by the SSC board

The Curriculum is concentrated mainly on three subjects:

- * English Language
 - * Mathematics

- * application of concepts using math statements aiding both language comprehension and understanding of mathematical operations.

INTENSIVE COACHING

- * in-house tutorial program for grades 8, 9 and 10.
- * tutorial support to prepare them for grade 12 board exams.

BMC IN-SCHOOL PROGRAM

* Teacher support provided for grades 9 & 10 at 2 BMC schools * Teacher support for pre-primary to grade 2

SCIENCE

- * introduced to children in grade 8
- * focused on strengthening scientific concepts adhering to the SSC syllabus books.

SAC Monitoring and Evaluation





SAC follows a curriculum curated in-house for its Learning Center Programs. Volunteers are trained periodically by experienced trainers on curriculum delivery and classroom management.

Assessments are conducted thrice during the year. Progress of students is captured across 5 levels in English and Math as in the table below.

Baseline tests are conducted in the month of July where students are assessed on learning levels and grouped for sessions. Content Workbooks are provided to each student in English and Math basis their baseline levels.

Midline tests are conducted prior to Diwali break to assess understanding.

Endline tests are conducted by mid-March and final levels of captured for the next year. Children who complete level 5 move on to being coached in their textbook curriculum.



SAC's Intensive Coaching initiative started for the grade 10 students in 2017 and now includes students studying from grade 8 to F.Y.BCom in 2019.

Individual attention, small group sizes, qualified teachers and regular progress monitoring has helped us improve results every year. Children perform better without stress giving them the opportunity to join good colleges.

Intensive coaching support is provided by Samarth Whaa classes headed by Hanumanta Natekar and Kalpesh Rajput, Shah Classes and volunteers of both, our Lokhandwala and Juhu centers.





SAC also collaborated with 3 BMC schools for the In-School Support Program to impart better education with qualified teachers using latest methodologies. Experienced teachers and volunteers took on the responsibility to coach higher secondary students at 1 English Medium and 1 Vernacular Medium BMC school. We also continued our partnership into the 2nd year for In-School Support for Pre-Primary to Grade 2 at a newly opened BMC school.

Under the leadership of SAC the dormant practical lab of one of the school's was given a new lease of life ensuring that science practicals critical to curriculum were conducted.

SAC also took on its first batch of 7 NIOS students in the academic year 2019-2020. The results in all the schools is a testimony to the hard-work and dedication of our team.









Females account for almost 48% of the Indian population. Providing equal opportunities and empowering them would mean doubling the nation's power to build a prosperous society and economy. Investing in the positive growth of women not only ensures support for the future generations with needs beyond education, but also enables women to shoulder financial responsibilities of their households helping alleviate poverty and fueling sustainable economic growth.

SAC learning centers have a population of between 40-50% girl children. To ensure girls continue with higher education or vocational training, SAC sponsors fees for their college education, tutorials and vocational training. Girls and their mothers are also counseled on abuse, rights, gender discrimination and the need to speak up.

With majority of India's population being young, the need to provide them with skills, educational or vocational, is imperative for gainful employability.

SAC aims to provide skill development alongside main-stream education to ensure more job-opportunities for students. We have collaborated with Antarang Foundation for the World of Exposure Program to expose students to careers across myriad industries. Students are also enrolled for digital literacy courses and STEM innovation hubs to help build vocational and critical thinking skills.

We endeavour to provide maximum support to children with clear career goals and are working fervently towards it.

STEM EDUCATION:

Universe Simplified: Innovation Hub



The Universe Simplified Innovation Hub is a three level STEM hands-on program for students of grade 7 and above. The students move from learning about mechanical projects at Level 1, electronic projects using capacitors, transistors and sensors at Level 2 and programming projects with LOGIC, MIT Scratch, Arduino and Website Development at Level 3.

2019-20 is the 3rd year of our Innovation Hub Program with a total of 103 students across all levels at Juhu and Lokhandwala centers.

Under the program, concept explanations are provided and students are encouraged to think and make items using the concept taught. The aim of the program is to build scientific thinking skills, encourage ideation and creation of solutions for common problems applying scientific concepts.

A culmination Science Fair is held every year where students make and display projects based on their learnings. The ingenuity and passion of children never ceases to amaze us.




















SEL EDUCATION:

Apni Shala Foundation | Fly Higher India





Our collaboration with **ApniShala** SEL Program continued for the 2nd year. SEL module focused on Cultural Diversity, dealing with Bullying, Teamwork, Responsibility, Emotions and Empathy. This year we introduced the Social Awareness Program (SAP) aimed at building awareness in children about their surrounding, connect with the community, identify and understand its problems, research, collect, collate and analyze data to come up with solutions.

Children are continuously assessed on criteria like Confidence, Communication, Teamwork, Leadership and Empathy by the facilitators. Positive behavioural changes have been noticed in children attending the program.







Fly Higher India conducts monthly sessions with the children of grade 4 and 5 at the Juhu Center. Every session is centred on a theme with a message. The 2 hour session aims to sensitise and get them to think on topics such as Reuse-Reduce-Recycle, Mindfulness and Out-Of-Box Thinking. The children retaining the lessons taught to them by the FHI Team in itself speaks volumes of the success of this program.

END OF YEAR EVALUATION




Year 2 of our collaboration with Antarang Foundation for the World of Exposure (WoE) program for our 8th and 9th grade students has been very enriching. The objective of the program is to expose students to a variety of industries and potential career opportunities therein.

This year, apart from regular industries, sectors like Healthcare, Trades, Public services were also covered which were real eye-openers for the children.

Student outcomes pre and post program showed:

- they know how to explore careers
- an increase in understanding of exposed careers
- an understanding of long-term career orientation
- an understanding of Careers and Industries
- they have clarity of career plans



ARTS:

CAN Speech and Drama Classes | Shefali Shah Art Classes





After the superb results achieved by our students at the Level-1 Trinity Speech exams, a group of 14 SAC students appeared for the Level-1 Trinity Group Drama exams. Under the mentorship of the teacher at CAN classes, affiliated to the Trinity College of London (TCL), the children clinched an average score of 90%!

Trinity College London is an international examining board that has been providing assessments since 1877. Each year nearly 600,000 candidates in over 60 countries take Trinity exams which are internationally recognized around the world.

In an attempt to prove that all talent really needs is the right opportunity to shine, this year SAC in collaboration with CAN classes took up two talented vernacular medium students to give the exams which are conducted in English Language. Relentless efforts by the classes and SAC volunteers saw the children bag a 90% in their exams.









A drawing competition held earlier last year yielded some promising students in the field of fine arts. This group of chosen students are mentored by Shefali Shah Art Classes in structured art syllabus with the intent to get them to give their art exams in the future.





Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages.









Not only does disease impact the well being of an individual, it burdens family and public resources, weakens societies, and squanders potential. The health and well being of people at all ages therefore lies at the heart of sustainable development. Protection from disease is not only fundamental to survival, but it enables opportunity for everyone and strengthens economic growth and prosperity.

SAC partners with clubs like the Rotary and Lions to hold medical camps for the children to keep a check on deficiencies if any. Most of our beneficiaries have only a single meal in the entire day. In a healthy body lives a healthy mind so essential to focus on education. To achieve this a wholesome snack is provided to every child daily under our #SACkitchenPlan. We have collaborated with a local caterer to supply hygienic, tasty and nutritious snacks.

Matters related to adolescence, puberty and oral hygiene are also focused on with regular interventions from doctors, educators and partner schools.





COVID-19: RELIEF & ADAPTING





This March hit us with an unexpected pandemic situation. Many SAC student families were in dire straits due to the lockdown. We believe it was our moral duty to stand by them in this moment of crisis.



Operations at our Learning Centers were suspended due to Covid19 but learning at SAC continues. SAC volunteers and teachers made all efforts to move to online platforms to ensure children dont miss out on learning. Though availability of digital devices, network issues and migration are challenges, we are making all attempts to provide them with devices, mobile recharges, worksheets, and stationery support

Online tutorials for children from Grade 8 to 12 have commenced to ensure that students are not overwhelmed when schools and colleges reopen.
